Can a specific service licensee with a 4B waste code (as it applies to the authorizations listed in NRC license 11-27610-010) perform work on 30.14, 30.15, 30.18, 30.19 under "process" for disposal, 30.20 under "process" for disposal, and 40.13 even though our license doesn't state it, since they are exempt from licensing or unimportant quantities?

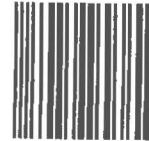
