8. Training is accomplished by online course work using NEO nuclear education online given through the University of New Mexico, in addition to in house training on the specific SOPs utilized at IndyVet to maintain ALARA and compliance with our NRC license.
9. Facilities and equipment are identical to our original licensing.
10. Radiation safety program is composed of refresher training done by the RSO in house to review our SOPs annually, which can include online refresher coursework regarding radiation safety. Such refresher training is documented in our written materials.

MATERIALS LICENSE

Pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-438), and Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter I, Parts 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 39, 40, and 70, and in reliance on statements and representations heretofore made by the licensee, a license is hereby issued authorizing the licensee to receive, acquire, possess, and transfer byproduct, source, and special nuclear material designated below; to use such material for the purpose(s) and at the place(s) designated below; to deliver or transfer such material to persons authorized to receive it in accordance with the regulations of the applicable Part(s). CONDITIONS

10. Licensed material shall be used only at the licensee's facilities located at 5425 Victory Drive, Indianapolis, Indiana.
11. The Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) for this license is James R. Speiser, D.V.M.
12. Licensed material shall be used by, or under the supervision of, James R. Speiser, D.V.M.
13. The licensee is authorized to hold radioactive material with a physical half-life of less than or equal to 120 days for decay-in-storage before disposal in ordinary trash provided:
 - A. Before disposal as ordinary trash, byproduct material shall be surveyed at the container surface with the appropriate survey meter set on its most sensitive scale and with no interposed shielding to determine that its radioactivity cannot be distinguished from background. All radiation labels shall be removed or obliterated.
 - B. A record of each disposal permitted under this License Condition shall be retained for three years. The record must include the date of disposal, the date on which the byproduct material was placed in storage, the radionuclides disposed, the survey instrument used, the background dose rate, the dose rate measured at the surface of each waste container, and the name of the individual who performed the disposal.



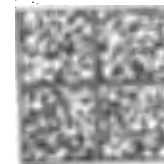
