I was reviewing the amendment and it looks like there's an error in Item 8C. Can you check and verify if the wording there is correct? We presume the license should say 5 uCi per nuclide and 20 uCi total – OR – it could be 50 uCi per nuclide and 200 uCi total. But I think it's the former.

Hi Tara!

Just checking in – I hadn't received an amendment license to # 19-00296-10 (broad scope license addition for possession of atomic numbers 93-96 plus Pu-238 and Pu-239) as of yet. Our last conversation on July 18 seemed to have finalized the suggested wording for nuclides and max

amounts, and I recall you saying you would wrap this up and send out the amended license by the following week.

I wondered if it was possible that you submitted it in hard copy form (U.S. Mail)? I've learned that it might take 1-2 additional weeks to reach me if that's the case. If it's possible to fax or scan me a copy of the amended license, I would be able to immediately share with the vendor who is intending to ship the new alpha calibration source to us. (That's Eckert and Ziegler, if you recall.)

I don't mean to badger! I'm OK with settling in for the wait. But on behalf of the researcher who is anxious to receive the source, I'm obliged to at least ask the question.
