Again, please be advised that WRT does operate under a Rad Materials license within the Commonwealth, either specific or general. Is it possible they are operating under a different name? Neither WRT nor Sutherland were found in a search of our database.

That said, we have reviewed the NRC's draft EA, concur with the conclusion as presented on page 25 of that document, and have no further questions or comments...other than why the Commission has reason to believe WRT operates under a Virginia (specific or general radioactive materials) license.

It appears, however, that WRT does operate its uranium recovery system under general license within the Commonwealth, at a location in Sutherland, Virginia.
