Dear Sir or Madam:

Living in New Mexico is a treasure most of us take for granted. The nature; the plants and animals; the perfect weather; the canyons, mountains and desert; the inspiring Native American tribes and pueblos – there is no other place like this on Earth.

But it is important for those of us fortunate enough to live here to share our space and our perspective with people like you who live in distant places like Washington DC. Many of the environmentalists I've spoken with are passionate about preserving what they see as their slice of paradise here in NM. I understand, but think they are off base when they talk about the proposed Holtec project in Lea County. But I think your environmental review document can help them better understand the proposal, the technology and the proven safety features of the project.

It's time we bring facts forward and prioritize balance rather than extremism. I was a young person in the 1970s and remember full well some of the tragedies that befell our environment. But that was a long time ago and I think a lot of the falsehoods masked as facts, along with natural fear of the unknown in the environmental community is spreading and is really damaging.

Fake news is not just on the right – it's alive and thriving on the anti Holtec websites. It was also out in force at the public meetings. Science appears important to many of them when talking about endangered species, but somehow it doesn't work in this nuclear discussion. I claim no special expertise, but I'm smart enough to know that the NRC does. I have also been doing some reading on the project and am a strong believer that we can continue to have a beautiful and environmentally rich New Mexico without reverting to witchcraft disguised as science.


To whom it may concern,
