PURPOSE: To discuss the design improvements proposed for the replacement steam generators for Turkey Point including:

1. Improved moisture separators (newdemister vanes, perforated plates, etc).
2. Use of Type 405 ferretic stainless steel for support plates.
3. Quatrefoil design for tube support plate interface.
4. Thermal treatment of Inconel 600 tubes.
5. Recessing tube to tube sheet weld.
6. Expanding tube to full depth of tubesheet.
7. Increasing recirculation ratio.
8. Increased number of hand holes.
9. Improved tube bundle accessibility.
10. Improved flow distribution.
11. Modifications to feeding.
12. Installing tube lane blocking devices
