SRM – COMSECY-18-0004

Commission approved the proposed Joint Composite Adversary Force (JCAF) approach on April 2, 2018 for Entergy and NextEra facilities for 2018 and 2019 only.

Commission directed the staff to provide an assessment and options for a long-term alternative to the NEI-managed CAF.

Purpose of the Public Meeting

 Are there other options the NRC should be considering?

 Are there other criteria that should be included in the NRC's evaluation process?

Potential MAF Options

- Industry Provided MAF:
 - Single MAF provided by the industry via NEI
 - Single MAF provided by the industry via independent oversight/advisory board
 - Multiple MAFs: Each utility or independent site would maintain their own MAF
 - Multiple MAFs: Status Quo NEI CAF and Entergy & NextEra JCAF
- NRC Provided MAF
 - Federal Partner
 - Contract via Vendor

Evaluation Criteria

- Credibility of the MAF
 - Consistency and reliability regarding tactical application
 - Team Composition
- Sustainability/Risk
- Impact on Licensee Activities
- Knowledge Transfer
- Conflict of Interest
- Financial Impact (Industry & NRC)
- Implementation
- Oversight Administrative and Operational
