PUBLIC HEARING ON APPLICATION FOR ADDITIONAL SPENT FUEL CAPACITY
SALEM NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION

On January 15, 1978 my husband and I wrote to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at the above address (same title on letter as above) requesting a public hearing on the application by NRC for additional spent fuel capacity at Salem. We also requested a copy of this application.

Apparently you were the recipient of this letter.

This morning Mrs. Korman (who has also asked for a public hearing) called to tell me you called her and asked her to relay a message to me. She kindly accommodated your request. If I interpret your message correctly, my request for a copy of the application is not going to be granted because I'm supposed to be able to find it in the Public Document Room at the Salem Public Library, Salem, N.J.

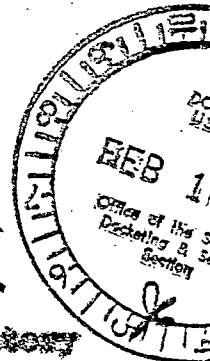
I have searched the Public Document Room in the past for information and have found it very difficult to locate information. Before going to the Salem Library today, I used one of the very nice services offered by this library. You can call to be sure the book or information you want is there before going down there. When I called the Salem Library Miss Fogg was very cooperative, as usual, and offered to look for the information I described to her. (Part of the information relayed to me by Mrs. Korman from you was that the report was 30 or 60 pages - so I also included this information).

When Miss Fogg explained that this information is usually filed by someone special (didn't know name) and not by the ordinary librarian but that this special person had not been in for a couple of months to file or discard duplicates or whatever, we felt the job of finding this application might not be such a difficult task. All of the incoming information for the past couple of months was in a place on a pile. In about an hour she called us back and said she had gone through all of this unfilled information and the only thing she found on spent fuel was a letter Betty Korman had written to the NRC.

Obviously if Miss Fogg (the librarian) couldn't find this application there is little chance of my finding it. Since there is no assurance this application was or is or ever will be in the Public Document Room I am again requesting a copy of this application.

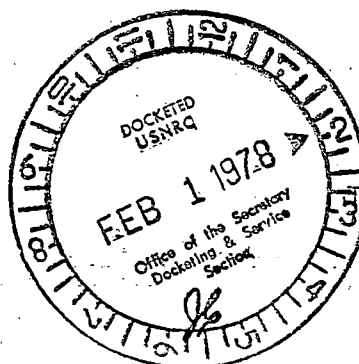
