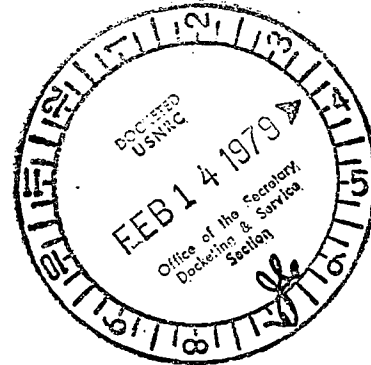

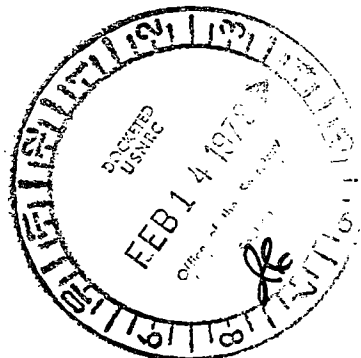
Dear Senator Roth,
