
Ms. Robinson informs me that she attended a meeting held here in South Jersey which was lead by officials of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. The meeting was held in Salem, New Jersey. At that meeting only those people within a 10 mile radius were allowed to speak concerning the generating station and plant. There were many others present who live outside the ten-mile area who would be affected in the event of an accident at the plant.

I would appreciate it if you would examine this situation and advise me of the reason for this decision of the NRC. Also I would appreciate any information regarding how the NRC obtains public comment and how that comment is handled after being obtained by the NRC.
