Dear Mr. Squire:

On December 18, 2018, and January 14, 2019, an inspector from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) conducted a routine inspection at your Beaumont Hospital facility in Dearborn, Michigan. The purpose of the inspection was to review activities performed under your NRC license to ensure that activities were being performed in accordance with NRC requirements. Mr. Luis Nieves of my staff conducted a final exit meeting by telephone with you on January 31, 2019, to discuss the findings. This letter and the enclosed Security Addendum present the results of the inspection.

During this inspection, the NRC staff examined activities conducted under your license related to public health and safety. Additionally, the staff examined your compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations as well as the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, and interviews with personnel.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that one Severity Level IV security-related violation of NRC requirements occurred. The violation was evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The security-related violation is cited in the enclosed, non-public Notice of Violation (Notice) (Enclosure 1). Details of the security violation are available in the enclosed, non-public Security Addendum (Enclosure 2). The NRC is citing the violation in the enclosed Notice because the inspector identified it.
