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Eric,

I finished reviewing your RAI responses for a second time. Because we have 5 of the same type of service activity license applications in-house at this time, we wanted to review all the application responses before requesting more information, to be sure we are treating all the applications as consistently as possible.

We have been in contact with the program office regarding our request for guidance about the need for an Environmental Assessment for these D&D service licenses. We were recently told that a response is expected to be provided to us in early July. This is not great news for any of the applications we are reviewing, because I know that any outdoor work is planned for the spring through fall weather.

Additional information needed:

Your response to our request for procedures for remediation and decontamination stated that you develop these procedures on a case-by-case basis. I understand that. If you could send me at least two examples of such remediation procedures [certainly you may redact the client name], that would be appreciated so that we understand the scope of your procedures. It would be best to have one example of what you consider your "typical" remediation activities, and at least one that is complex [required more aggressive decon activities, more complex remediation such as ductwork/pipe chases/buried tanks/etc, soil contamination below 15 cm, significant PPE for workers due to radiological or other hazards, site-specific DCGLs, etc] At least one of these examples should have outdoor area remediation, at least one should have indoor remediation activities.
