Dear Mr. Gibbs:

As your contractor implied, there is no reason to do a complete DFP but you do have to account for more than just inflation. A few questions you need to answer:

1. Is your program handling more or less material than it was three years ago?
2. Have you generated and storing more waste than three years ago?
3. Are additional areas of your facility contaminated or has contamination affected areas outside your facility?
4. Has your radioactive materials waste vendor raised his rates more than the rate of inflation?
5. Have labor rates, according to the BSL charts for technicians, Health Physicists, et al. outpaced inflation?

If the answer to those questions is "No" and your program has not decreased in size, then the assumption that raising your financial assurance by the rate of inflation is correct. If any of the answers to the questions is "Yes," then you would need to recalculate the DFP for those portions affected.

I hope this is of some help.

In 2018 I asked Radiation Safety Associates, Inc. (RSA) to perform an evaluation of our Decommissioning Cost Estimate. RSA provided me with a Letter of Methodology explaining that the current amount of money found in Timken's Decommission Trust Fund would be enough to fully fund the decommission of our facility at this time.
