Dear Mary Celotti

As you are hopefully aware, the State of Vermont intends to enter into an Agreement with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Under the Agreement, the NRC would relinquish to the State regulatory authority for certain licenses authorizing the use of byproduct, source, and special nuclear material. It is anticipated that the Agreement would become effective on or about September 30, 2019.

As an NRC materials licensee located in and/or authorized to use radioactive material only in the State of Vermont, your existing NRC license will be transferred to the State. The NRC license will eventually be converted by the State to a State of Vermont license. It is anticipated that the converted license will be issued to you by the State no later than 90 days after the effective date of the Agreement. Additionally, upon the effective date of the Agreement your annual fees will be issued by the State of Vermont.
