Dear Secretary of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission,
We are residents of San Luis Obispo County and are strongly opposed to the opening of Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant. But we also feel in the event of the opening regardless of the dangers and consequences, an Emergency evaluation plan must be established. In compliance to an article in the newspaper on suggestions for the components of an Emergency plan, we are writing with the following suggestions:

- ① Exposure of radiation to the public should be completely eliminated within a 15 mile radius.
- ② The plan should include treatment for other forms of radiation exposure to the public.
- ③ Naturally, the plan should be proven capable of evacuation of the public.
- ④ The plan must be mandatory before licensing of a new power plant.
- ⑤ The individual power companies must be responsible for informing the public in the event of disaster, and the residents of the evacuation area should receive a letter informing them of the plan before a disaster.
- ⑥ A member of the Nuclear Regulatory Comm. should be posted at all power plants, and have complete control in event of an accident.
- ⑦ The utility company owning & operating the plant should bear the entire cost of the plan, and the public cannot be responsible for any of the cost.

We hope you understand now very important this issue is to us.
