

REPLY TO NRC LETTER DATED AUGUST 8, 1979
NRC INSPECTION REPORT 50-217/79-03 AND 50-318/79-07

ITEM A RESPONSE:

Upon notification, the Radiation Safety and Chemistry Group immediately posted the low level radioactive storage trailer, Spent Fuel Storage Room, and storage pad West of Units 1 and 2 Auxiliary Building in accordance with 10CFR20.203. Additionally, an inspection was performed by Rad-Chem of our entire facility which revealed that no other areas or rooms required similar posting. Particular attention was given this item by reinstruction of all Rad-Chem Technicians by the Radiation Safety and Chemistry Foreman in the requirements of posting radioactive materials storage areas. To aid in preventing recurrence of this item procedural change was made to clarify when an area became a radioactive materials storage area; i.e., whenever radioactive materials that exceed 10 times the quantity of such materials specified in Appendix C of 10CFR20 are intended to be stored in any area for periods greater than twenty-four (24) hours.

Full compliance is considered to have been achieved as of May 24, 1979.
