



RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Goldsboro, York County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby resolved by the authority of the same:

WHEREAS, the recent accident at Three Mile Island Nuclear Power Station has clearly indicated that the Federal, State, and Local governments are not adequately prepared to effectively handle this type of situation, and

WHEREAS, it is apparent that the Federal Government and its regulatory agencies as well as the State and Local governments have inadequately prepared for this type of accident, and

WHEREAS, the problems which were revealed during the recent accident concerning notification to the citizens and effectively dealing with the nuclear accident must be adequately resolved for the protection of the citizens before nuclear energy is generated again at Three Mile Island, so that the citizens do not have to live in constant fear of another nuclear accident, and

WHEREAS, as a result of this accident it is not presently known what effect the many releases of low-level radiation will have on the health and well being of our citizens, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government has not taken adequate steps to alleviate the problem associated with spent fuel which is now being stored on site.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that Goldsboro Borough Council does hereby request that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission postpone the start-up of Unit Number 1 Reactor at Three Mile Island until necessary actions are taken to assure the safety of our citizens.

FURTHERMORE, we hereby request the following actions also be taken in the best interest of our citizens:

1.

The Federal, State, and Local Governments through adequate planning and funding, be prepared in the following areas:

to effectively respond to another accident of this magnitude or greater:

- A. Communications and Emergency Notification;
- B. Advance training of all government agencies including local level, and the issuance of new radiation detection equipment to adequately monitor any future releases;
- C. That the N.R.C. be prepared to immediately respond adequately to any accident of this magnitude or greater immediately upon notification of such and to upgrade all areas of response indicated to be deficient during the TMI accident;
- D. That the proper Federal and State agencies conduct an immediate Health-Environmental-Financial impact study of the surrounding affected areas to determine what effects the accident has had on our citizens and publicly make recommendations. This study should consider the psychological impact of the TMI accident.

2.

The Federal Government decide how to deal with the removal of the spent nuclear fuel now being stored on the site and inform the public of the plan for removal of the fuel and adequately protect the safety of the citizens during such removal.

3.

That the start-up of nuclear generation at Three Mile Island not begin until all official investigating agencies have completed their investigations and until the above plans and actions are completed and the results of the same are taken into consideration by the appropriate agencies of government and all problems be resolved to provide the safe living environment for our people.

The foregoing Resolution having been processed in accordance with law is hereby sustained this 11th day of May, 1979, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Goldsboro.



I, Jane Lee of R.D. 3, Box 3521, Etters, PA 17319

do hereby request permission of the Secretary of the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission to participate in testifying at the TMI - I hearings tentatively scheduled for February 1, 1980.

My request is based on medical and environmental information garnered by me over a three year period. This information/reports, signed by all those involved, encompasses farms within a five-mile radius of TMI. The Veterinarian, who services this area as well as a three-county area, can confirm these occurrences.

Because most of these findings occurred prior to the accident of Unit 2, it is my thought that perhaps nuclear power plants are emitting more than just radiation and therefore are affecting the wildlife, livestock and the environment itself.

Living on a farm has taught me how precious all life is. We are all dependent on each other. When the animals begin to weaken and fall, when the birds begin to disappear, when the smaller animals begin to reveal reproductive problems, this eventually threatens the survival of man. Due to these and other occurrences, I respectfully request time to submit this information to the NRC Panel selected for the purpose of deciding the continued operation of Unit 1 at TMI.
