Dear Chairman Hendrie:

As a stockholder in VEPCO fed up with what this filthy rich utility is getting away with not only concerning the unnecessary high rates it is always seeking but its total disregard for safe construction and operation of its nuclear plants (they have been cited for hundreds of nuclear safety violations over the past few years), I am writing in support of your moratorium and strongly urge that you keep it in force until all safety standards have been fully met by all nuclear plants.

Governor Dalton and his cronies are only interested in big business and how much industry can be brought to this state regardless of the consequences. I am concerned more about the air I breathe and the water I drink than allowing a nuclear plant to be opened just to supposedly save a few dollars.
