Dear Mr. Seyfrit:

Two copies of the attached interim Significant Deficiency Report are submitted pursuant to CFR 50.55(e)(3). The twenty-four hour notification required by CFR 50.55(e)(2) was given by Mr. E.W. Creel to Mr. C.R. Oberg on June 8, 1979.

Due to the involvement of suppliers in reworking flood damage equipment, it is not possible to accurately determine when all work will be completed. A target date of January 1, 1980 has been established; but, until arrangements with suppliers are complete, the likelihood of meeting this schedule is unknown. When all equipment has been reworked or replaced, we will submit the final report to advise of details which may come to light during the re-work-inspect-test process.
