
Dear Mr. Hendrie:

Enclosed is a copy of a telegram sent to you on
June 5, 1979.

When a member of my staff telephoned to get an
address for the telegram we were told that you do
not give your address over the telephone. My staff
member clearly identified herself as an employee of
a Member of Congress. I would appreciate your pro-
viding me with an explanation for this policy. I
can think of no reason why a Member of Congress
should be denied an address for the delivery of
legitimate correspondence. I wish to further point
out that the individual answering the telephone,
a woman, was exceedingly rude to my personal secretary.
The telephone number called was 492-7000.

I realize that a great deal of public hysteria exists
over nuclear power and that there may be security
reasons for taking certain steps to protect NRC
facilities. I am of the opinion, however, that the
NRC staff should be properly instructed on how to
handle inquiries from Members of Congress in a
courteous and responsive manner. Your immediate
attention to this matter would be appreciated.
