I, Jonathan Howard Kamras, wish to  
to intervene as a party in the ~~hear~~  
safety hearings on the Allen's Creek  
Nuclear Reactor Project.

I assert that I have standing to  
intervene, based upon the effects that  
the reactor would have on me personally.  
I rent an apartment in Houston (at  
1901 S. Voss Rd. #7),

The apartment I live in is within 40  
or 50 miles ~~far~~ from the proposed site of  
the reactor. The reactor ~~will~~ <sup>would</sup> affect me in  
the following ways:

1. The reactor will increase greatly  
my electricity bill, thus preventing me  
from making any improvements to my immediate  
environment with those diverted funds.

2. The high cost of electricity will  
also prevent my present landlord, or any  
landlord from whom I might rent in the  
Houston area, from making improvements to  
the rental housing.

3. The reactor will put out 4 times  
the radiation of any other commercial  
reactor in the United States, and cause  
a tremendous increase in leukemia and other  
radiation related diseases. This will divert  
medical resources and increase the cost <sup>281</sup> <sup>295</sup> of  
health care for me ~~be~~ because I have

4. The increased cost of electricity, ~~and~~ the emission problems, ~~and~~ the difficulties with on site spent fuel storage, and the general problems with ~~the~~ intermediate spent fuel storage in geologic formations in the state of Texas (which will become necessary), all will drive potential employers away from Houston.
