Gentlemen:

Thank you for any and all hearings prior to any decision re-licensing of the Allen Creek Nuclear Plant of the Houston Light and Power Co.

Having heard that consideration is being given to having such meetings in the small village of Wallis, Texas, I am concerned that such location would be unfair to the great numbers of people living in the City of Houston, i.e., very much affected by the Nuclear Plant, and yet deprived of the privilege of attending such meetings due to transportation problems.
