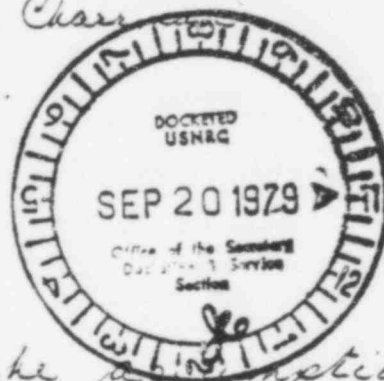

To Whom This May Concern:

I would very much like to request a hearing on the TMI reopening issue. I am a homemaker and an inactive nurse instructor. My husband and I have one son, age 8, and two daughters, ages 5 and 21 months. We are presently living in the Colonial Park area of Harrisburg. We own several apartment buildings in Middletown and found Middletown to be quite attractive because of its being steeped in history and because of its being centrally located. For these reasons, we entered a contract to buy a small farm several miles north of Middletown. We had planned to move onto the farm in the not-too-distant future, restoring the old farm house and incorporating energy saving devices when adding an addition to the house. All the while, we felt terribly uncomfortable about TMI being so close.

And then the accident occurred, bringing to fruition our concern and fear of nuclear power. Inevitably, accidents will occur and I am horrified at the ramifications. As time goes on, we realize the importance of taking low-level radiation seriously. It is just not safe! It is also much too expensive!

I really try to lead my family to quality living, being concerned about the type of food we eat and carefully screening the television we watch. I must admit I find the nuclear power plant disgusting — we have no choice of the radiation we receive and no power over what is done at TMI.

So here we are caught in a dilemma, drawn by the Middletown farm and the potential for quality living there and repulsed by the prospect of being able to see the towers from our backyard and, worse yet, the prospect of potential harm to our family from radiation. I vote to close TMI permanently and turn our attention to renewable energy sources!

Furthermore, I feel it is unconscionable to operate a nuclear power plant so close to the prime agricultural land of the Lancaster area, one of the "Garden Spots of the World."

It seems to me there are strong forces in the world that would make us think we have to use nuclear power - that we have no choice but to do something that would ultimately be harmful to those presently living and to posterity. It is time for the strong and courageous to say "No!" to such forces and instead seek alternative energy sources and seek stringent conservation of energy.
