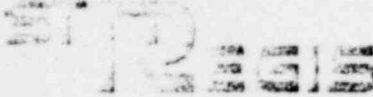

Dear Mr. Hendrie:

As a manager in an industry which is energy intensive, I have a natural concern about the availability of reasonably priced electric power. The recent events at Three Mile Island resulted in an immediate and severe financial impact on Metropolitan Edison and its customers.

Presently, replacement power to supply the needs of Met-Ed customers is costing about \$10 million per month. When TMI Unit 1, which was not involved in the recent accident, is returned to service, the replacement energy costs will be reduced by about \$6 million each month. Obviously, the savings to the utility and its customers is significant.

To reduce the financial burden on Met-Ed and its customers, it is essential that TMI Unit 1 be returned to service as soon as possible. Assuming that all regulatory-safety procedures have been completed, please do everything possible to expedite the necessary approval.

Dear Sir:

Burdett Oxygen Company is currently operating an air separation plant in Reading, Pennsylvania. Our monthly power consumption in manufacturing operations is 4 million kilowatts.

Since the accident at Three Mile Island Number 2 generating facility, our power costs have increased by approximately 20%. This increase in rate reflects passed on charges for power purchased by Metropolitan Edison in replacement of power which would have been generated at the Three Mile Island facility.

In our rate structure we are currently being charged a fixed rate representing the facility fee for Three Mile Island Number 1 generating station. Burdett has been given assurance that the Number 1 facility was undamaged in the accident. In addition, the NRC has allowed recommissioning of all other Babcock & Wilcox reactors of this type following modifications as prescribed by the NRC. Three Mile Island Number 1 could easily be prepared for restart before January 1, 1980.

The NRC should seriously consider allowing the restart of Number 1 unit as per the other Babcock & Wilcox reactors as soon as safely possible. This action will allow Burdett Oxygen Company and the other manufacturing industries to receive the benefit of a viable generating station for which we are currently paying the capital cost and once again have our products be competitive in the marketplace with those produced in areas not served by Metropolitan Edison.

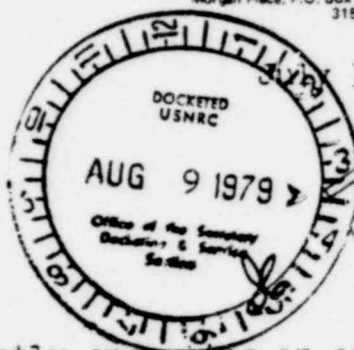

Mr. Chairman:

As a large consumer of energy in the form of kilowatt hours, it has been brought to our attention that there could be a substantial increase in the energy cost adjustment by our supplier, the Pennsylvania Electric Company.

Pelelec indicates that failure to permit the start-up of Three Mile Island Unit #1 as soon as feasibly safe to do so, would require an addition of 1.5 mills or 23% after January 1, 1980 to the energy cost adjustment which is currently at 6.5 mills per kilowatt hour.

Quaker State urges you to proceed immediately with a thorough review of the safety requirements for TMI Unit #1, and to subsequently permit the start-up of this Unit as soon as all necessary safety precautions have been performed. The current energy crisis demands that we utilize all available safe energy sources. We believe that the TMI #1 can be a source of safe energy.

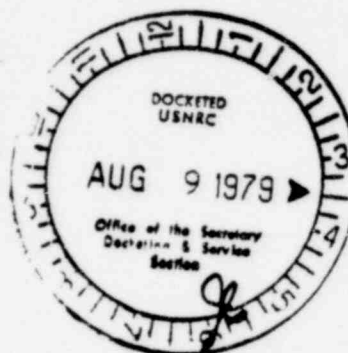

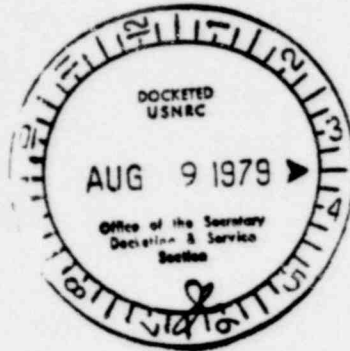

My company is one of the major users of power in Berks County supplied by Metropolitan Edison Company. The cost of electricity in the manufacture of our various products is a most significant item. It is my understanding that our costs of electricity will escalate considerably as time goes on if the Unit #1 at Three Mile Island is not returned to service.


I request that you approve the reactivation of Unit #1. I fully recognize that Metropolitan Edison must comply with all of the NRC modification requirements.

If there is a long term outage of Unit #1; as I have already mentioned, our costs will be adversely effected because of the expensive power replacement from Metropolitan Edison. It is my personal strong feeling that nuclear power is here to stay, and that it is one of the viable alternatives that must be developed in our country. Again, I urge your favorable decision to allow Metropolitan Edison to reactivate Unit #1 at Three Mile Island.
