The Nuclear Regulatory Commission recently published a Federal Register Notice announcing our intent to submit an information collection request to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for NRC Form 277, "Request for Visit." 4. How can the burden of the information collection be minimized, including the use of automated collection techniques or other forms of information technology?
