Dear Mr. Infanti:

We last spoke about a year ago regarding the status of the Lakeshore Toltest (LTC) bankruptcy and of nuclear gauges possessed under the licensee's radioactive materials license. My most recent message from you indicates that there was a de minimis sale of the gauges planned for late September 2017. Could you please provide an update as to whether that sale took place, and the whereabouts of the gauges? If you are unable to provide such an update, could you please refer me to an individual who could do so?

As long as the Lakeshore Toltest radioactive materials license (NRC License No. 34-35052-01; NRC Docket No. 030-38628) remains active, the NRC is required to continue to assess fees. Once the gauges have been transferred, in the interest of public health and safety, it is best if the license may be terminated. Specific information is required for our office to terminate the license. I am happy to provide guidance to you or another licensee representative in order for LTC to move ahead with a termination request. Once the license is terminated, NRC will be able to stop assessing fees.

I have also left a voice message for Jason Manfrey of Fox Rothschild LLP in pursuit of a status update.
