Greetings,

As part of a graduate program in Nuclear Engineering, I am researching civilian licenses for byproduct material usage. An Ohio company, the J. C. Haynes Company, obtained a license in 1970 to obtain Americium (I think from Oak Ridge National Laboratory) to enhance or color diamonds. The license was restricted in 1981, apparently due to repeated violations. In 1985, the company was raided, the materials confiscated, and a cleanup performed. I believe the NRC wrote a report on this event entitled:

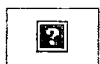
Inspection report of unauthorized possession and use of unsealed americium-241 and subsequent confiscation, J.C. Haynes Company, Newark, Ohio  
Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Glen Ellyn, IL (USA). Region III

The report was issued in 1985 (November, I think), and perhaps given the number NUREG 1153. I cannot find this report anywhere, and so am requesting it from you. I am willing to pay the associated costs of tracking this down and providing me a copy, but would appreciate you letting me know the cost before you perform any work.
