SUMMARY AND ACTION REQUIRED (IF ANY) On 8/21/19, M. Gryglak and J. Dinkins discussed the following:  1) Ms. Dinkins stated that she had worked at the Michigan Cardiology, P.C. since 2016. First she was trained under Dr. Lee, former RSO, and then she was named as the RSO on NRC License no. 21-32110-01. She worked part time. The clinic used to be open three days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday) and had an average of 12- 14 patients per week. The licensee used Tc-99 in unit doses. The radioisotope was ordered from Hot Shots Nuclear Medicine in Lansing, Michigan.  2). Ms. Dinkins stated that she had met Dr. Hassan (twice), however, they did not have a thorough discussion regarding the details of the radiation protection program. Ms. Dinkins stated that Dr. Hassan was a cardiologist and mainly did vascular testing, echo testing, and ultrasounds at his other location. Dr. Hassan did not do any imaging with radioactive material.  3) Ms. Dinkins was generating a list of items to discuss with Dr. Hassan such as whether the licensee will maintain MPC Physics Consultants, LLC to perform the annual audits of the radiation protection program, whether the same pharmacy will be supplying the radioisotope, etc.

4) Ms. Dinkins stated that she had the keys to the hot lab which is locked. There are some sealed sources for calibrations, no unsealed material in the hot lab at this time. Ms. Gryglak asked Ms. Dinkins to provide the keys to Dr. Hassan so he can open the hot lab during the planned site visit on 8/26/19.

5) Ms. Dinkins stated that the last patient was seen on July 10, 2019. Dr. Hassan purchased the building and the equipment on August 6, 2019. Ms. Dinkins believes that Dr. Hassan will do some renovation before reopening the facility.
