
Written comment number (2) list Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) 333-102-0310(11)(c)(A) and (B) for Alternate criteria for license termination. The appropriate OAR is 333-102-0310 section (12), titled "alternate criteria for license termination", sub-section (e) includes the statement 'has provided sufficient financial assurance in the form of a trust fund'. Therefore, we feel this rule satisfies Section 20.1404(a).

Written comment number (7) states that Oregon needs to insert references "40.46 and 70.36" within OAR 333-102-0305(3)(b). However, 10 CFR Parts 30.35, 40.36, or 70.25 may be the appropriate regulations to reference.

We believe the final rules satisfies the comments received from letter dated September 18, 2017 for compatibility and health and safety categories established in the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards procedure SA-200.
