Enclosed is Amendment No. 46 to your NRC Material License No. 24-00196-07 in accordance with your request.

This amendment requested a change in the name of the chairperson for your Radiation Safety Committee (RSC). We prepared this amendment in accordance with your request.

However, we do not require that the name of the chairperson for the Radiation Safety Committee for a Type A medical broad scope license be listed on the license itself or in the documents supporting the license in the last condition of the license.

NUREG 1556 Vol. 11, Rev. 1, published February 2017, states in section 8.7.2 that the licensee (relevant parts excerpted only) "should submit the following:

- description of the duties and responsibilities of the RSC
- criteria used for selecting members of the RSC, including what members and the number of members constituting a quorum. Members should be indicated by position title, rather than by name
- criteria and procedure describing the approval process used by the RSC and RSO for authorizing new users and new uses."

As the second bullet above states, "members should be indicated by position title, rather than by name."

In a subsequent amendment, we suggest that you update your license condition nos. 12.B, 12.C, and 23 by requesting that the name of the RSC chairperson be removed from your license, in favor of only describing the criteria used for selecting members of the RSC, including the position title.

The enclosed document contains sensitive security-related information.  
When separated from this cover letter this letter is uncontrolled.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you.

This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
