Dear Sir:

I write this letter to express my opposition to the licensing of the Comanche Peak nuclear power plant which is now being built in Somervell County, Texas. Realizing that the nation face an energy shortage, I nevertheless believe that nuclear power using presently available plant and disposal technology poses a threat, not only to my generation but perhaps to many generations to come.

I cannot with clear conscience support nuclear energy when the exact nature of radiation's effects on life are not fully known or understood. I do not consider it in the best interest of the people of the state of Texas to have the Comanche Peak plant operational when the N.R.C. environmental impact statement on the plant states that risks of cancer or genetic disorders as caused by the plant's operation would be "undetectable" yet not nonexistent. Finally it seems incomprehensible to me that we should continue to license nuclear power plants and still lack a viable plan for the disposal of nuclear wastes.
