

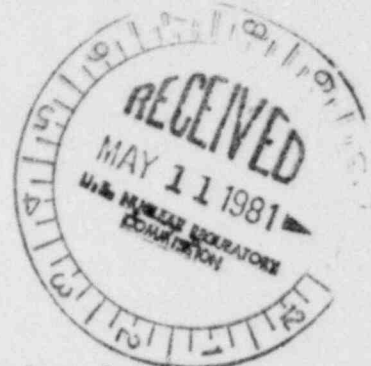

Dear Mr. Crutchfield,

In response to your letter of April 1, 1981, please find enclosed the revised R.E. Ginna Nuclear Power Plant, Security Training and Qualification Plan and our response to the NRC comments on the original plan submittal.

As a result of the NRC's initial review of our plan the document has been substantially revised to include information and commitments responsive to the NRC comments. In order to facilitate your further review of this plan we have also enclosed a document entitled, "RG&E Responses to the NRC Comments on the Training and Qualification Plan." The RG&E Response document should be used as a reference source to locate additional information and commitments now incorporated in the revised plan.

In addition to the revisions precipitated by NRC review, other sections of the plan have been placed in a new format in order to simplify implementation. The responsibility Matrix (Task and Duty Summary) showing ten (10) shift assignments has been consolidated into four (4) duty positions for qualification and compared to the same crucial tasks. The history of Tasks, Conditions, and Standards has been numbered sequentially and placed in a paragraph format providing the additional information requested.

In accordance with the provisions of Title 10 Part 2.790(d) the information contained in the "Security Training and Qualification Plan is deemed to be proprietary and should be withheld for public disclosure.
