Prompt Notification Systems

Your letter dated July 1, 1981 contained information requests regarding the schedule and design of the prompt notification systems required by 10 CFR 50, Appendix E, Section IV, D.3. Our letter L-80-274, dated July 1, 1981 informed you of the efforts we have taken to date, and of the uncertainties and problem areas still to be resolved. We requested in that letter that an extension of six months (until January 1, 1982) be granted to allow completion of delivery and installation of the systems.

Pending the completion and testing of the prompt notification systems, County and/or State agencies are continuing with established plans to alert and notify persons in offsite areas by dispatching law enforcement vehicles with mobile siren/public address systems to affected areas.

The Alert and Notification Systems, ordered from Whelen Engineering Co., Inc., consist of 125 dB rotating electronic sirens with public address capability. The system operates on 120 volts A.C. with battery back-up for each siren. Lighted display control panels are provided in primary and back-up locations for each site. The sirens are activated by a six digit, time sequenced radio frequency tone series which prevents false activation.
