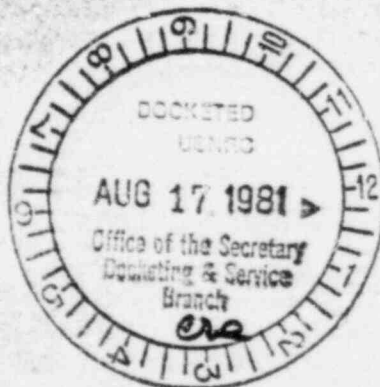


Dr. Palladino,
