Mr. Moore,

This email is in response to your request dated October 24, 2019, to amend your NRC license to reflect a change in RSO. In order to continue our review, we need additional information as listed below. Please note that all "Section" references refer to NUREG 1556, Volume 1, Revision 2, "Consolidated Guidance About Materials Licenses – Program-Specific Guidance About Portable Gauge Licenses" found at <https://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/nuregs/staff/sr1556/v1/>.

1. Are you seeking authorization to change your location of storage? The amendment request letter only explicitly requests a change in RSO. However, your letter contained a facility diagram as an attachment showing a proposed change in the gauge storage location.
 - a. If yes, please provide the following:
 - i. Confirm that the address of the storage location in question will remain 630 Cross Lanes Drive, Nitro, West Virginia. **(Section 8.3)**
 - ii. Please describe who all will have access to the gauges or storage location and confirm they will have appropriate training (e.g., no unauthorized individuals will have access to the gauges). **(Section 8.8)**
 - iii. Please provide a description of the physical controls to protect the gauges. Please describe the room or storage container the gauges will be stored in as well as a description of access controls for the physical storage location (e.g., demonstrate that there will be at least two physical controls forming tangible barriers to prevent unauthorized access or removal of the gauges). **(Section 8.9)**
 - iv. Please provide confirmation that dose rates in adjacent areas will be maintained in accordance with federal regulations. **(Section 8.10.5)**
 - b. If no, please state that no changes in the location of storage are requested at this time.
2. Would you like the NRC to update the licensee management contact for the license to "Roderic E. Moore, Vice President"? We had previously listed Mr. Benjamin Greene II as the licensee point of contact in addition to listing him as the RSO, however we can evaluate replacing him for both titles at this time. **(Section 8.13)**

We will continue our review upon receipt of the requested information. You may respond to my attention in writing by letter or email (if letter is signed by senior management and scanned into a pdf format), referencing mail control number 617124.
