

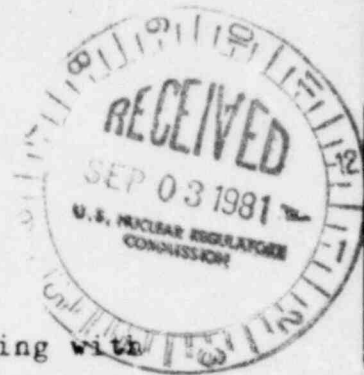

This is a letter of petition to intervene in the proceeding with respect to issuance of an operating license for the Limerick Generating Station now under construction by the Philadelphia Electric Company (PECO).

My direct interest in the proceeding is clear enough: I am a homeowner, with a wife and two small children, living within a 5 mile radius of the proposed plant, at Collegeville, Pennsylvania. This proceeding's business directly effects the personal safety of my family, the value of my property, and the welfare of the community in which we live. I belong to no organized group pro or con nuclear power. I am simply a citizen who feels somewhat intimidated by the powers-that-be to impact so severely on the quality, including the emotional security, of our lives.

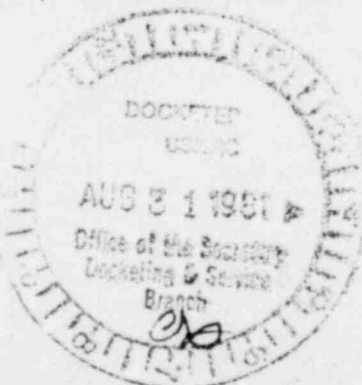
