I am a resident of Van Buren County, Michigan, which is a largely rural and highly agriculture county, stretching the shore of Lk Michigan to the West and stretching East almost to the city of Kalamazoo.

On the shore of Lk Michigan is Palisades nuclear power plant, located in the South Haven/Overseer area. This plant has become the subject of a great deal of attention lately because of the planned use of a dry cask storage system for spent nuclear fuel rods. This is the reason I am writing to you.

"Spent" fuel rods from nuclear reactors are the most highly radioactive substance on the planet. I am extremely concerned and distressed that Palisades may be allowed to store these spent rods in casks - within yards of Lk Michigan! We cannot risk the potential of leakage/penetration of radioactive particles into Lk Michigan! It does not make sense. Storing these rods is a problem. Let's use our heads and store them somewhere isolated from a source of one of the largest bodies of fresh water on the planet. It's the only planet we have - we must act responsibly.

I urge you to consider the impact your decisions and actions will have on the future.

I'm not wild about having a nuclear reactor in my backyard in the first place. PLEASE do not allow the storage of the spent fuel rods onsite.
