Enclosed is Amendment No. 13 to your NRC Materials License No. 24-32591-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that, based on the licensed material and uses requested your license annual fee categories have been changed. Specifically, the following program codes will be for your license: 3234, 3219, 3220, 3221, 22110, 22111, 22150, 22151, and 11200; and the associated annual fee categories will be required for your license. For your references, a link to the descriptions of the program codes is on the NRC's website at <https://www.nrc.gov/materials/miau/mat-toolkits.html> and the annual fee categories are listed in the NRC regulations in 10 CFR 171.16 which can be found at <https://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/cfr/part171/part171-0016.html>.

Based on your request, we updated Item Nos. 6, 7, 8, and 9 regarding the licensed material and uses. In addition, we updated License Condition No. 12 regarding the decommissioning financial assurance requirement, License Condition No. 14 regarding the written agreement between the licensee and its customers, and License Condition No. 17 regarding the records of decommissioning. We added License Condition No. 13 regarding the emergency plan, License Condition No. 15 regarding the radioactive material originated from your customer sites, License Condition No. 19 regarding the decommissioning activities at temporary job sites, and Licensed Condition No. 22 regarding radiation protection actions at temporary job sites.


Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
