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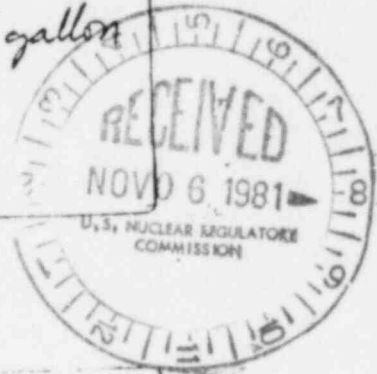
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Dear Sirs,

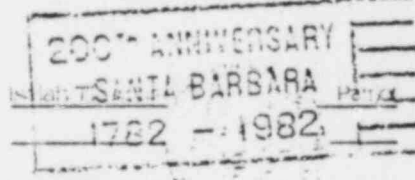
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Hello - I wish to express my concern regarding the

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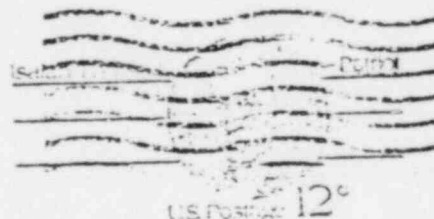
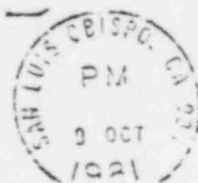
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President Reagan's lifting of the ban on fuel reprocessing
