Dear Mr. Palladino:

I am writing in regard to the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant licensing. I am a Californian, as well as a wife, mother, and employee. I care about what is happening here, (in CA.), as I care about what is happening all over America. I am not going to try and convince you of my opinions. I personally prefer alternative means of energy sources, such as the sun, but that is my viewpoint, and I am not trying to push that on you.

However, I do believe, Mr. Palladino that there are some convincing arguments against Diablo which we may share, regardless of presently existing viewpoints. Are you aware of the "gas leak" which occurred in San Francisco, approximately 5 weeks ago? Pacific Gas and Electric responded to the situation as supposed, however, it was later 'discovered' that the gas line (which contained a standard gas commonly used in such underground lines), contained asbestos and P.C.B. P.G. & E. had been previously ordered to clear the lines of any asbestos. They obviously failed to comply. The P.C.B. was supposedly cleared from all lines according to P.G. & E. Yet, P.C.B. was escaping with the gas just 5 weeks ago! P.C.B. is a known carcinogen. 45 minutes lapsed before P.G. & E. notified the press and the general public of the presence of P.C.B. Meanwhile, thousands of people were in the area (This incident occurred in the busiest part of downtown San Francisco). Is this the kind of agency you want to license for nuclear power management? I am aghast! Please inquire into the P.C.B. matter further if you don't wish to take my word on it.

I am aware that gas leaks are different from nuclear power management, but that is the crux of the situation. If simple gas lines cannot be adequately maintained, how can we expect nuclear power plants to be maintained? Serious consideration should be given to the capability of such an agency to maintain rules and regulations.

Mr. Palladino I am sure you are aware that Diablo is located on the San Andreas Fault Line. I don't know if you have ever been in an earthquake, so I will explain something. A small one causes the earth to shift, adjusts the position of houses, and (if powerful enough), uproots whatever is in the way. It's a strange sensation - to experience a "tremor" (minor earthquake). In a big quake imagine what would happen to the people of California, possibly half the country? Mr. Palladino, we don't have all the answers. There are some things humans are not meant to know. Why should we risk this precious life we have for the pursuit of "energy".



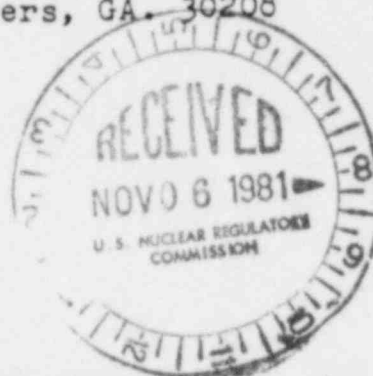

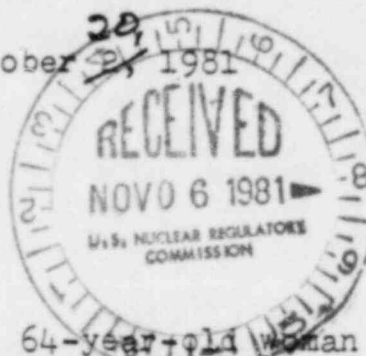

Dear Mr. Palladino:

I am a serious, non-hysterical, 64-year-old woman who lives with my husband in Los Osos, 8 miles due north of the Diablo Canyon plant. In the light of the latest Diablo problem, I trust you will consider this letter and map carefully.

I have had some correspondence with Harold Denton, and was pleased to read of your encounter with him in the San Francisco Chronicle. Frankly, the real problem with Diablo has been the hotshots in both PG&E and government, from the beginning. But I want to make two points, while trying to keep this brief.

1: Diablo is one of those cases where meteorological conditions should have been considered specifically, as promised in NUREG-0654. West coast winds sweep across the land at 3 or 4 times the speed allowed for, in NUREG's lengthy requirements for staff actions, in a plant emergency. NUREG allows "from one to four hours" for exposure to cross the 10-mile evacuation zone. Our winds, as shown on the map, allow from 15 minutes to a half hour.

Yes, we hear that higher winds break up the radiation; but most Diablo opponents rank that among the statements by, or on behalf of, PG&E which eventually prove false. (Like their statement during the blockade, that Diablo's safety "has been confirmed time and time again.")

Partly because of our winds, partly because of the Hosgri fault, and partly because of distrust of PG&E, the second point may be more of a problem than the NRC realizes:

2: It is virtually impossible for our local officials to present a really feasible evacuation plan for this area. With presentation of the plan possibly delayed till after startup of the plant, NRC should realize this, as shown on the map.

(I sent this map to the then NRC and several other officials 18 months ago; one of the recipients sent back NUREG-0654, anonymously.)

Mr. Palladino, we who live in these winds and fear Diablo put absolutely no faith in NUREG statements that humans are in danger only to the 10-mile line, cows only beyond that line. Whatever plan may be accepted (if any), neither NRC nor local officials can control our instinct for self-preservation.

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Thousands of us will be up and out on the roads, at the first jolt of a large quake, or the first hint of an emergency at Diablo, because we know the time is limited. (Please don't think I'm panicky or trying to panic you. My husband and I have camped all over this county for twenty years; we know the roads and the people.) Let's look at those roads, on the enclosed map:

The Pacific naturally blocks escape to the west. The coastal road running north from Morro Bay has only one road leading inland, and four gas stations, from Hearst Castle to Carmel -- about 85 miles. This is the Big Sur road, winding along stair-steep slopes, often closed in fog or storm, and for a couple of days after a heavy storm, for road-clearing.

Freeway 101, north and south, is the only "safe" route, since incoming traffic might be stopped, thus allowing four lanes outgoing. However, there are very few supply points along this road, beyond our county lines. (We are, according to the 1980 census, about 200,000 people -- fairly isolated, here at the south end of the high Santa Lucia Mountains.)

The three roads eastward from Paso Robles, Atascadero, and Santa Maria-Vandenberg, run almost immediately into the barren desert strip along the San Andreas Fault. There are about a dozen gas stations in that whole sweep. Thousands of people can be stranded, with no supplies or medical help. Or water; the road from Santa Maria appears to have a river along it, but in the dry season you have to know where to dig for water in its bed. In summer these roads have killing desert temperatures for unprepared people.

I'm sorry, but that's the general situation.

* Our situation in Los Osos-Baywood Park, 8 miles north of Diablo, is this: 11,000 population, with two roads leading out. The one east toward San Luis is to be avoided; it runs parallel to Diablo, and if the winds are blowing southeast, San Luis people may be flocking down it to get upwind of Diablo.

The other road goes 5 miles north to Morro Bay, a narrow 2 lanes winding between a cliffy hillside and the dropoff to a marshy bay shore. Near the far end are twin bridges; both high water during rainstorms, and accidents, close this road fairly often. ~~A helicopter then stands by, for medical emergencies.~~ (The county is never going to have money enough to widen this road and raise the bridges.) (NO MORE.)

We are a bedroom community, most adults at college or working, daytimes, in Morro Bay or San Luis, or retired. There are 3 crowded schools, but since most children walk, there are only a couple of buses to evacuate them.

* We are WITHIN the required evacuation zone, of course.

Enough! I trust you are still with me, and will check into some of these matters. George DeBord, Editor and Publisher of the Morro Bay Sun-Bulletin, will give you honest answers whether they are for or against Diablo. I'll enclose his number. We have to put our faith in people like you, who appear to be standing up for justice and safety, and recognizing the great responsibility they assume, if Diablo runs.

We still can't believe our fellow-Americans will choose Diablo over us. That would really (we think) be saying that the billions already spent by PG&E are worth more than our lives...
