in Rates attributed to that construction, at least partially;
AND that such Rates are reflected in our Electric billings,
(even though we are beyond the Limerick plant area) we are in
the Conowingo/ Peach Bottom area, and supplemental electric
Energy is supplied by Philadelphia Electric, which inflates
the billing to us; has already and will increase since the
recently allowed Rate hike.--(see our Petition under "C").
Therefore we feel justified in protesting the continued con-
struction of the Limerick Nuclear facility, and hence no need
for the requested Operating License.

NRC Now Trying to Bypass NEPA in Licensing Change

When the Kemeny Commission described the "mindset" of the NRC as a fundamental fault of the agency in its TMI Report, the nation hoped that positive reform would quickly follow. Instead, we are sadly discovering that the real lessons learned from TMI are to exclude members of the public from access to information, access to the hearing process, and access to legal recourse wherever the NRC can arrange it. Using the TMI-1 Restart hearings as a testing ground, NRC has been steadily restricting who may appear, how they may behave, what issues they may raise, what documents they may obtain, what questions they ask, even what mail service they must use. Now NRC proposes that "Need for Power" and Alternative Energy Sources" issues be excluded from reactor operating licenses, even though the choice of a reactor may have been predicated on electricity demand 10 to 15 years

Dear Sir:

The Public is gullible, so they want to do it again! what?? Raise the RATES on Electric Service. In March an additional "Energy Cost Adjustment" was added to the billing, to cover the charges from Philadelphia Electric, supplied from the Conowingo Hydro/Peach Bottom-Nuke. Logical "inflation".

Now PE is requesting another "Rate-hike," and admitted to help finance the Nukes — which the public customers did NOT ask for, and it is a fact that with the TMI's out, there has not been a shortage of juice, either when Peach Bottom was out-of-service!

To add to the Nuclear confusion, P.E. anticipated the need for MORE Nuke juice, so started a plant at Limerick; since decided, by on-line date - '85, it would not be needed! However they want to complete it and try to sell the power to another Utility, — (perhaps Salem, N.J. which has trouble, shut-downs!)

To finance this — (interest on debit) they are feeling their customers to invest in Common Stock — worth as much as U.S. currency — (promise to pay) (out of Debits!)

This is just a suggestion, if you don't like another "Energy Cost Adj." to your service bill, make protest to:

Philadelphia Electric Commission, Harrisburg, Pa.

That they may exercise their authority to refuse the request, and save that Rate increase.

Rationally, we realize there will be money to DO something with TMI's, Beaver Valley, etc, and the recourse is the public, either Rate-hike, Government-Taxes, or (perhaps!) the OIL Cartel/Of course the Oil-men control the Uranium industry, and don't want the Nuclear Reactors to fold-up, so they will prime the Government — (you and I-tax-payers) to carry the boondoggle along with the danger of accidents, NO safe, permanent depository for the WASTE.

Like us here in Maryland, NO Deposit Here! So they are trying a place in Eastern New Mexico, and getting the same resistance.
