Dear Mr. Palladino:

THE DIABLO CANYON PLANT MUST NEVER OPEN!

This reactor is sited only 3 miles from an earthquake fault, discovered after construction began.

Why did not the NRC stop construction immediately?

Now a major flaw involving the stress analysis of pipe supports has been found. This flaw may affect the ability to withstand earthquakes -- which occur periodically along the Pacific coast.

The PG & E Company, the builder has announced an indefinite delay.

HOW COULD IT BE THAT THIS PLANT WAS ISSUED A LICENSE?

WHAT KIND OF INSPECTION DOES THE NRC DO?

Your credibility is zero. You didn't inspect a major diagram. You weren't even able to find a major design flaw.
