As a resident of the State of California, the problems of nuclear plants at Rancho Seco and Diablo Canyon are presented to me on almost a daily basis through newspapers and television. I am particularly concerned about the multiple problems at Diablo Canyon.

The first concern was the plants' proximity to a fault line and the possibility of a major accident if an earthquake should occur in that area. We were assured the plant had been built for safety under these conditions. A few days before the opening of the plant, structural defects were discovered.

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The were supposedly corrected.
Then, more structural defects
were discovered which would
make the plant extremely hazard-
ous under earthquake conditions.
I, for one, have lost confidence in
the safety of these systems, not only
from the standpoint of structural
weakness, but also with regard
to the disposal of nuclear wastes.

I hope your Commission will
review these problems thoroughly
and place the welfare of the residents
of California above all other
considerations. Thank you for
taking time to share these
concerns.
