Gentlemen:

On April 11, 1989, the NRC issued Supplement 3 to Bulletin 88-08 which provided information concerning a new valve and piping configuration which could result in unacceptable thermal stress and requested that licensees review their previous responses to the Bulletin to determine the affect, if any, of this new configuration. Carolina Power & Light Company has completed an evaluation of the systems connected to the reactor coolant system at Brunswick and has determined that there are no piping systems susceptible to the conditions described in NRC Bulletin 88-08, Supplement 3. This information is submitted in response to a verbal request from the NRC staff.

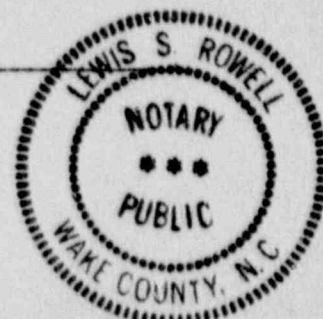
