PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY'S SUPPLEMENTAL
RESPONSE TO THIRD SET OF WRITTEN INTERROGATORIES
AND REQUESTS FOR THE PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS FILED
BY SAN LUIS OBISPO MOTHERS FOR PEACE

Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") herein provides a supplemental response to "Intervenor San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace Third Set of Written Interrogatories and Requests for Production of Documents to Pacific Gas and Electric Company," dated March 8, 1993 ("MFP's Third Set"). This supplemental response provides additional information in response to Interrogatories 27, 28 and 29, respectively, relating to Fire Areas 5-A-4, 5-B-4, 30-A-5, 10 and 20.

Interrogatory 27:

Please identify (by date, fire area, and unit) and missed or late fire watches within the conditions set forth above, and copies of documents which record occurrences of missed or late fire watches.

Supplemental Answer to Interrogatory 27:

None.

Interrogatory 28:

Please identify any open fire area doors which you identified during the course of your fire watches within the conditions set forth above, and provide copies of documents which record occurrences of open fire doors.

Supplemental Answer to Interrogatory 28:

On one occasion (March 8, 1993), door 235-2 was noted as being open to provide ventilation. Personnel working in the area had obtained the Operations Shift Supervisor's permission. This was confirmed by the F/W foreman. This door was not required to be operable at this time (2R5).

Interrogatory 29:

Please identify any discrepant conditions which you noted during the course of your fire watches within the conditions set forth above, and provide copies of any documents which record those discrepant conditions.

Supplemental Answer to Interrogatory 29:

The following issues were noted by fire watches but are not considered an impairment as defined in the fire protection program.

Fire door 234-A-2 was noted on six occasions as having two abandoned screw holes in the door where a sign had been removed. These 1/16" holes did not impair the door (July 26, 1992, July 28, 1992, September 7, 1992, December 2, 1992, December 19, 1992, February 27, 1993).

On September 5, 1992 fire door 223 was noted as "will not self-close, mechanism broken." This condition did not prevent the door from being manually closed and thus the door was considered fully functional. However, AR #276243 was initiated and the self-closure mechanism repaired on December 17, 1992. This door and AR number were again documented on September 13, 1992.

A log entry on October 22, 1992 states "12 KV switchgear room. In front of cabinet that has a sign on it that says No Flammable storage allowed. 2 plastic bags full of combustables (sic) are taped up in front of the cabinet." These cleaning rags were being used for a job in-progress and the amount did not exceed the transient combustible limits. This condition was again documented on October 24, 1992.


On October 25, 1992, Fire door #225 was identified as "knob very loose - almost off." This door knob was repaired by the plant locksmith.

On December 26, 1992, fire door 239-2 was noted as "knob are (sic) coming loose from door." This door knob was also repaired by the plant locksmith.

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

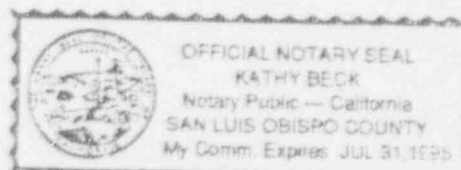

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
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
