Dear Sir:

I am writing in regard to the nuclear power plant. I read in the Front News Magazine that they are going to add two more nuclear units at the Davis-Besse site in Oak Harbor.

I have also read that nuclear power plants are not safe and that poor training, faulty construction, inadequate inspection, and unproven safety systems and measures have allowed many problems to arise during nuclear plant operations. Three nuclear engineers say a major atomic power plant disaster is likely within twenty-four years.

In 1974 there were 1,421 accidents at the operating nuclear power plants in the country. A number were potentially dangerous. The accidental destruction of a nuclear power plant's core could be deadly up to thirty miles away, depending on weather conditions. It has been proven that there has been an increase of infant mortality, cancer, and other health problems near nuclear plants.

What is being done about the safety measures where more units are built? Could you please let me know what is being done about this problem?
