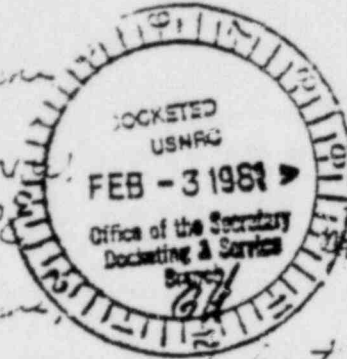

I have seen reports by the American Nuclear Council, the American University Medical Dept as well as U.S. and foreign sources that show potential fatalities from nuclear plants on a scale of 100,000 people, while commercial reactors in the United States and perhaps even 3-5 deaths per year.

There, unless you have some evidence to the contrary, the biggest hazard associated with the Three Mile Island accident is associated with the NRC's presentation of the report in Unit #1. Has any study been done which shows a potential reactor hazard outside of the known nuclear situation?

I would greatly appreciate hearing of the NRC's assessment of this factor. It is noted that Three Mile Island is restarted and I would urge you to carefully examine to come along with the development of new techniques to provide positive action.
