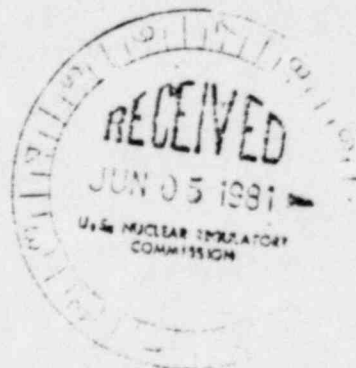
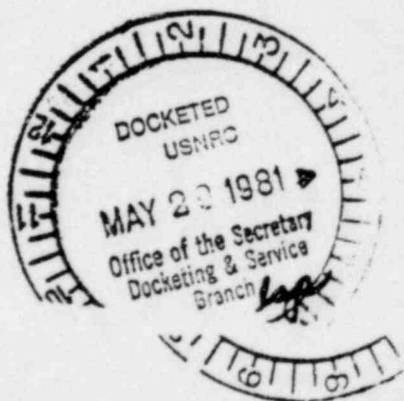
Although I have been a stockholder of General Public Utilities for many years, I am convinced that to restart Unit 1, TMI, would be the wrong thing to do. The public is now aware of the weaknesses of TMI, Unit Two. These weaknesses were pointed out before the start-up. The resulting disaster has shaken the faith of the public not only in the capacity of GPU to guard the welfare of the area but in the NRC for permitting the final granting of the license to go on line.

Regaining lost public trust should be a first priority. Restarting Unit 1, the same kind of reactor, certainly would make the country feel that the public interest was being betrayed.

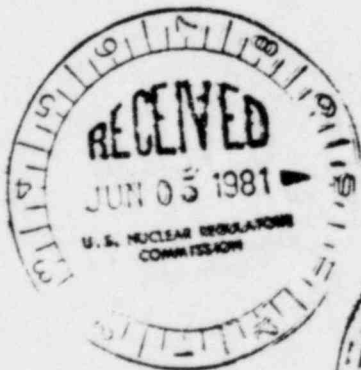
