We will forward to you and to the Secretary the SHPO's opinion on eligibility. Once this is resolved the compliance process can proceed.

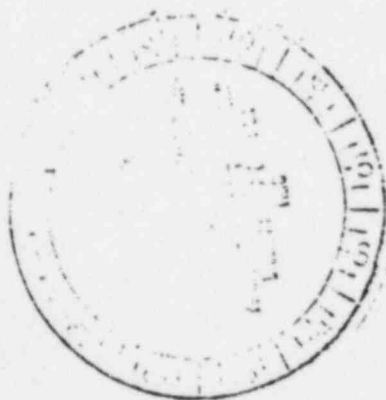
Thank you for your cooperation in this lengthy matter.
