

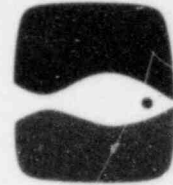

**Puget Sound Power and Light Co., et al.; Availability of Draft Environmental Statement for Skagit/Hanford Nuclear Project, Units 1 and 2**

Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission's regulations in 10 CFR Part 51, notice is hereby given that a Draft Environmental Statement (NUREG-0894) prepared by the Commission's Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation related to the proposed construction of the Skagit/Hanford Nuclear Project, Units 1 and 2, located in Benton County,

Washington, is available for inspection by the public in the Commission's Public Document Room, 1717 H Street, NW., Washington, D.C., and in the Richland Public Library, Swift and Northgate Streets, Richland, Washington. The Draft Statement is also being made available at the Office of the Governor, Planning and Community Affairs Agency, 400 Capitol Center Building, Olympia, Washington, and at the Benton-Franklin Governmental Conference, P.O. Box 217, Richland, Washington. **Wisconsin Public Service Corp., et al.; Issuance of Amendment to Facility Operating License**

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 43 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-43, issued to Wisconsin Public Service Corporation, Wisconsin Power and Light Company, and Madison Gas and Electric Company (the licensees), which revised Technical Specifications for operation of the Kewaunee Nuclear Plant (the facility) located in Kewaunee, Wisconsin. The amendment is effective as of the date of issuance.

The amendment modified the Appendix B Environmental Technical Specifications to delete sections relating to the protection of the aquatic environment. The Commission will rely on the NPDES permitting system administered by the State of Wisconsin for regulation and protection of the aquatic environment.

The application for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations.
